Greg Kulak and Dave Altheim, president and secretary respectively of the Stony Plain Fish and Game Association, presented the award on behalf of the association. The Mitchell award was created in the memory of two prominent conservationists who were active in the Stony Plain club and Alberta wildlife conservation generally. Schneider was presented the award for his work with the WWMC in informing Parkland county residents of the importance of protecting the health of Wabamun Lake for present and future generations of Albertans.
