The Wabamun Watershed Management Council (WWMC) is seeking active and committed people to be members of our Board of Directors.

The Wabamun Watershed Management Council is a registered charity, not-for-profit society that represents a cross-section of Wabamun Lake stakeholders who are committed to maintaining and improving the health of the lake and its watershed. It was formed in 2006 to address the concerns raised in Dr. David Schindler's report (2004), *Lake Wabamun: A Review of Scientific Studies and Environmental Impacts*. The WWMC provides consensus-based recommendations to its partners concerning watershed management within the Wabamun Lake watershed.

A Board Member...

- Attends and participates in board meetings (1.5 to 2 hours each month) and in committees (as needed);
- Participates in WWMC activities on the lake and in communities;
- Is part of a diverse governance team that strives to include representatives from lakeside communities, Indigenous communities, recreational lake users, conservation and environmental organizations, businesses/industry, agriculture and governments;
- Represents the WWMC to the public and in meetings with other stakeholders and WWMC partners;
- Is elected to the board at the October Annual General Meeting (AGM) and serves for a three-year term;
- May be appointed to the board between AGMs until elected at the next AGM; and
- May be re-elected to the board for an additional three-year term.

Qualifications

- You are active and engaged in your field or community and have a genuine interest in supporting the WWMC's vision and mission.
- You work well with others in a team environment, where issues are freely discussed, and you help achieve consensus-based decisions.
- You embrace the WWMC's core values of 'relationship with the watershed', good governance, collaboration, integrity and knowledge sharing.
- You represent at least one of the communities, organizations, businesses or lake users who are stakeholders in the lake and its watershed; and/or...

• You have certain skills of use to the board, such as organizational, financial, fund raising, public communication, Information Technology, education programming, etc.
